



The name "2 and a Crew" represents Julie, Scooter, and their vibrant, blended family. While most of "the Crew" have ventured off to pursue their own paths, Julie and Scooter remain at the heart of it all, taking on the heavy lifting. Their colorful and welcoming family ensures that everyone feels at home, and once you visit, you'll be embraced as part of the family, too.

A Taste of Comfort

A former culinary arts teacher, Julie crafts the menu from her own recipes, offering housemade comfort

food that's sure to make you smile. From hearty burgers and sandwiches to daily specials like brisket sandwiches or chili dogs loaded with "the kitchen sink," every bite is infused with love. They are also open on the weekends for a hearty breakfast.





• 1.15 pounds of ground chicken

- ½ cup pepperoni
- ½ cup mild Italian sausage (cooked)
- 1 cup Parmesan cheese
- ½ cup mozzarella or sharp cheddar cheese
- 1 cup marinara sauce
- Pinch of pepper
- Pinch of garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning

You will also need the following supplies:

- Parchment paper
- Large baking sheet **Instructions:**
- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. In a bowl, add the

3. Line the baking sheet



Featuring 45 local authors and a celebrity illustrator, South Texas AuthorCon, is set to happen February 14 and 15 at Plaza San Benito in San Benito, Texas.

This free event is in its second year and co-founder David Norec says it's a unique opportunity to feature local individuals.

"We want to showcase talent here in the Rio Grande Valley," he said. "It's to highlight the local talent, whether it's authors or illustrators."

This year Norec, who authored "The Adventures of Exo and Cy," hopes to double

event, which took place at the McAllen Creative Incubator last year. They had close to 1,000 attendees at the one-day event and featured 30 local authors.

The now two-day event will open to area schools on Friday, February 14. Students attending the event will get a free book and commemorative poster.

"Adding that day specifically for schools, we weren't able to do that last year," Norec said. "Hopefully that will lead to other opportunities with local school districts."

Co-founder David Leija, author of "TK's First Lesson," hopes the event will grow every year.

"We made a small splash last year," Leija said. "It's gonna pick up steam and it'll turn into a premier event."

Leija and Norec met and became friends a few years ago within the local author circuit. During conversations, Leija mentioned they spoke about the possibility of working together with the same goal in mind: to create a platform for local talent that would take place here in the Rio Grande Valley.

"The worst thing that'll

happen is no one shows up, right?" Leija said was a thought that crossed his mind when the event was initially discussed between the two.

Norec added his love for comic-con events also fueled the idea.

"I love going to comiccons. When I became an author, I thought it would be cool to have an author event but in comic-con style," Norec said.

On February 15, the general public is invited to visit. Attendees can expect to find food vendors outdoors and once inside, take part in panels and meet all the







Rescuing, Healing, Nonprofits and Rehoming Dogs in Need: Ana's Safe Haven

In the scorching heat of the Rio Grande Valley (RGV), it's all too common to see dogs abandoned on the streets. In a region plagued by animal neglect and overpopulation, one woman's response to this harsh reality became an urgent call for change.

Ana's Safe Haven Rescue is a nonprofit animal rescue organization, focused on rescuing, healing, and rehoming dogs in need. The rescue relies on a small network of fosters and donors in its efforts to ensure every dog is placed in a loving forever home.

Ana Tamez, founder and president of Ana's Safe Haven Rescue, is a passionate advocate for animal welfare, believing every dog deserves a second chance at a life filled with love. A retired Border Patrol agent, Tamez became deeply aware of the neglect and abandonment faced by animals in the RGV, especially in the harsh

tropical climate. Her journey into animal rescue began in the early 2000s when she started fostering animals at the Palm Valley Animal Center.

"I was already divorced, didn't have any kids... and I had two dogs at the time, so I said, 'Let me go to the shelter and look into fostering." Her fostering adventure spanned many years, filled with new homes in new locations and countless furry faces, but ultimately, when Tamez returned to the RGV, she realized she had the capacity to do even more. Starting small. Tamez created a dedicated rescue area on her property to offer abandoned and abused animals a safe haven. Over the years, the rescue grew, placing hundreds of dogs in forever homes. Her work isn't just about taking in animals—it's about giving them a second chance at life.

Ana Tamez's commitment to finding the best homes for her rescues often leads her to seek adoption

opportunities beyond the RGV. While she and her amazing volunteers (who Tamez is extremely proud of and grateful for) work tirelessly to rehabilitate and care for each dog, she recognizes that local resources are limited, and sometimes, the best fit for the animals is outside of the region. As a result, Tamez typically places

dogs in loving homes north of the RGV, even in other states, where the demand for adoptable dogs is higher.

The rescue's success stories are countless. One dog after another has found a loving forever home through Ana's efforts, and each adoption is a testament to the power of compassion.

Ana's network of fosters and adopters (many of whom generously support the rescue in honor of their new furry loved ones) continues to grow, as more people recognize the value in giving these dogs a better life.

And yet, with each success, Tamez remains humble, always focused on the bigger picture: educating the public about responsible pet ownership, spaying and neutering, and the importance of preventative care. As Tamez notes, "Many people really don't care about their animals... They see dogs as things, things they can just discard when they don't need them anymore." This harsh reality has driven Tamez's advocacy

for better treatment of pets, with a special focus on heartworm prevention—a silent killer of dogs that many owners fail to recognize.

Heartworms,

transmitted by mosquitoes, are rampant in the RGV due to the warm climate, making it a serious but often overlooked threat for animals. Tamez stresses that heartworms are preventable with proper monthly medication, but many pet owners either don't know about it or choose to ignore it until it's too late. By raising awareness, Tamez hopes to reduce the suffering caused by this disease and ensure more dogs live long, healthy lives. For her, prevention isn't just about saving money on costly treatments—it's about saving lives.

The rescue relies heavily on its foster network, donations, and fundraising efforts to

keep operating. Tamez has hosted raffles, worked with donors, and utilized online campaigns to cover medical expenses for the animals in her care. In addition to these often costly procedures, the cost of general care adds up. Tamez emphasizes that food and supply donations are always appreciated and welcome. "I can never have enough dog food," she shares with a chuckle.

Despite the financial challenges that come with running a nonprofit rescue, Tamez's focus remains steadfast: "The most important thing is rescuing more dogs." In addition to her ongoing efforts, Tamez dreams of expanding her reach.

"We could rescue a lot more," Tamez says, though she acknowledges the challenges of limited foster homes. Her commitment to responsible rescue ensures that she never overextends herself, a crucial lesson that has kept the rescue debtfree, unlike many other organizations facing financial struggles.

Ana's Safe Haven Rescue is not just about saving dogs; it's about changing the culture of animal welfare in the RGV. Tamez's message to the community is simple: "Have a heart. If you have space in your home, if you have an extra room, consider fostering. If you can't foster, consider donating or volunteering. It takes a village to make a difference."

As Tamez continues her mission, her impact



Artist of the Month Story of Worship, Inspiration, and Legacy

"Art is my outlet. It blocks out the world and lets me focus." With these simple yet profound words, local artist Marcie Rodriguez invites us

into her world, where creativity has become a sanctuary.

Rodriguez's roots are firmly planted in the Rio Grande Valley (RGV); raised in the small town of Lyford and now calling Harlingen home,

Rodriguez's artistic journey is as vibrant and textured as the RGV itself.

Rodriguez's artistic journey began in grade school, during a time when she was learning to navigate life's ups and downs. What started as a simple pastime in her art class soon became her refuge. Even now, art

remains a source of solace and a means of worship, often reflecting her deeply rooted Christian faith. For Rodriguez, creating art is an act of devotion and praise, with many of her recent works featuring religious themes.

Though primarily selftaught, Rodriguez's skill with charcoal—a medium

she fell in love with during high school—sets her apart. Charcoal, as she describes, is raw and real, allowing her to bring out depth and emotion in each piece. While she has embraced painting, starting with small canvases in 2019. charcoal remains her preferred medium, offering a stark contrast between light and shadow that enhances her evocative style.

Rodriguez's artistic influences include the legendary Frida Kahlo,

whom she admires for her cultural pride, resilience, and deeply personal style. Much like her idol, Rodriguez draws upon her heritage, infusing her charcoal works with themes of Mexican culture and a contemporary spiritual essence.

When asked about her experience selling art, she admitted that public art events aren't something she eagerly anticipates. Like many of the celebrated artists of the past—Cézanne, Van





Gogh, and even Kahlo who favored solitude while creating, Rodriguez also enjoys working in the comfort of her own company. "I'm an introvert. I can be in my house all day by myself and I'm happy," she giggles, adding that while she initially explored the idea of joining artfocused vending events, it wasn't for her. Instead, Rodriguez prefers to sell

her art through social media means, primarily Instagram and Facebook. Though she doesn't yet have a website, it's a goal she hopes to achieve in the future.

Currently, Rodriguez is not taking custom commissions, instead focusing on creating what inspires her. Someday, she dreams of having her own gallery. For now, she paints in a corner of

her living room. While the space is modest, she envisions having a dedicated studio where she can create, display, and sell her art.

One of Rodriguez's proudest achievements is her collaboration with Ramses Tacos & Tequila in Harlingen, where her art is displayed prominently throughout the restaurant's two locations. Seeing her work in such a popular space was surreal, and she considers it one of her biggest accomplishments.

Despite her success, Rodriguez stays grounded. As a single mother, she balances her artistic passion with the responsibilities of raising her son. She credits her son as her biggest inspiration, the person who pushes her to keep creating and striving for more.

Looking ahead, Rodriguez hopes to expand her repertoire by exploring landscapes—a genre she hasn't yet tackled. While many find portraits of humans challenging, she views landscapes as an even greater test of her abilities. She aims to push herself further and grow as an artist. And her advice to emerging artists is both practical and profound: don't let life get in the way of creating. "Especially if you're young," she adds.

"If it's something that you love and you know you're supposed to be doing... make the time to do it and keep on creating."

A poignant story Rodriguez shares involves her father, who passed away when she was very young. "He loved singing—it was his passion," she recounts. Her father had recorded his voice on a tape recorder, leaving behind a tangible piece of himself. This memory profoundly shaped her view on life and art. "You may not even know it, but you're leaving pieces of yourself every time you create something. People need to seek out what they love and leave their mark; tomorrow is not promised."

Transcending material possessions, she believes that leaving behind a piece of your passion, a piece of your art, is profoundly more important than material objects. "Whatever you love to do, leave proof

of it behind somewhere. Yes, people leave behind jewelry or clothes for their children but passing down a piece of what you love to do is so meaningful," she said, her voice filled with emotion. Rodriguez's words carry a powerful message: art is not just about expression, it's about legacy; every creation leaving behind a piece of the creatormind, heart, and soulto be appreciated and cherished for generations to come.

Marcie Rodriguez's heartfelt story inspires others to pursue their passions and leave their mark on the world. For Rodriguez, art is more than a hobby; it's a way of life, a means of worship, and a lasting testament to the beauty of creation in all its forms. Every stroke of her brush and every line of her charcoal sketches tells a story of resilience, faith, and a quiet determination to leave a lasting mark on the world. •

Leading the way for the Lady Hawks this year are starters Amira Rodriguez, Lexi Sandoval, Kara








